Whereas, on the _____ day of _____ 19____, Louisa Thompson died leaving in force and effect her last will and testament dated the 10th. day of August, 1915, which was duly admitted to probate in the County of Greenville, said state, wherein she devised a certain tract of land in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina containing thirty-one (31) acres of land to the parties hereinafter named; and

Whereas, the said deceased in the first paragraph of said will devised ten acres to her daughter, Annie M. Kinney, but in lieu thereof deeded to the said daughter before her death fifteen acres of said land and she is now the owner and holder thereof; and

Whereas, the said deceased in the second paragraph of said will devised the remainder of said land consisting of sixteen acres equally among her three sons, King Walker, Willie Walker, John Henry Walker, and her grand children the same being children of her daughter Mary and one child by the name of Janie Reese the daughter of the testatrix deceased daughter by the name of Hattie Montgomery; and

Whereas, the said King Walker died intestate on the _____ day of _____ 19____, leaving the children hereinafter named, and the said John Henry Walker died intestate on the _____ day of _____ 19____, leaving as his heirs at law the children hereinafter named; and

Whereas, the executor of said will had the said sixteen acres of land surveyed by D. B. Hunt on the first day of June 1923, and divided into three tracts, tract no. 1 containing four acres, tract no. 2 containing four acres, and tract no. 3 containing eight acres, plats of which tracts are hereto attached and made a part hereof, and the parties in interest having agreed to accept the tracts as hereinafter specified as their devise under said will:-

Walker, hereinafter called party of the first part, the children and wife of the late King Walker being Harriet Walker, wife, and Mimmie Bolden, Tom Walker, John Henry Walker, J. L. Walker, Will Walker, S. H. Walker, Mimmie Smith, and Flora West, hereinafter called parties of the second part, the children of the late John Henry Walker, being Brook S. Walker,
