Tax Collector's Tax Title.

Whereas by Acts of the General Assembly of the State of South Carelina, known as Sections 505, 520, 521, and 528, of the Civil Cede of South Carolina, 1922, Vol. 3, and other Acts of the General Assembly, provision is made that within a specified time after the expiration of the time allowed by law for the payment of taxes in any year in the County of Greenville, the County Treasurer of Greenville County shall issue in the name of the State a warrant or execution against each defaulting taxpayer in his County, directed to the Sheriff, requiring and commanding him to levy the same by distress and sale of so much of the taxpayers estate, real or personal, or both, as may be sufficient to satisfy the taxes, State, School, County and Special, of such defaulters; and

Further proceed in the manner prescribed by said statute to enforce the collection of said tax and after due advertisement sell the same before the Court House door of Greenville County as therein provided and Whereas, under and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, approved the 10th day of March 1928, the duty of the Sheriff of Greenville County with reference to the collection of delinquent taxes was conferred upon the delinquent tax collector, who has been duly appointed and qualified by law and is now discharging all of the duties required by said Act; and

Whereas there appears on the Tax Juplicate of Greenville County for the fiscal years commencing January 1st, 1927, and 1928, certain real estate consisting of all that percel or jet of land fronting 50 feet on Third Avenue, Park Place, Greenville Township, being Let No. 22 cenveyed to Thomas F. Bishop by Wilkie G. Morgan on Rebruary 12, 1912, recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Book 17, at page 489.

assessed in the name of Ollie Biship, and valued at Three Hundred fifty Dollars, the taxes, penalties and assessments thereon amounting to Thirty two & 86/100 Jollars; and

Whereas the above named Ollie Bishep, having neglected to pay the County
Treasurer of Greenville County the above taxes, assessments and penalties as prescribed by law,
an execution was issued therefor as directed by said Acts, on the first day of January 1927-28,
and ledged with the Tax Collector of Greenville County, and:

Whereas at a sale made on the Fifth day of May 1930, as directed by said Acts, by the said Tax Collector, after levy under said execution and the due notice, J. F. Graves, became the purchaser, and having paid to the said Tax Collector the said amount.

New therefore, I Estes Hewell as the said Tax Cellector of Greenville County, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of the sum of Thirty Three Dellars good and lawful mency of the United States, to me in hand paid by the said J. F. Graves, (a receipt whereof is hereby acknewledged) having granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents de grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said J. F. Graves, all that piece, parcel or let of land lying and being in the Tewnship of Greenville, Greenville County described as Let No. 22 frenting on Third Avenue Park Place, 50 feet, being the Let No. 22 conveyed to Thomas F. Bishop by Wilkie G. Mergan, February 12, 1912, and recorded in R. M. C. effice for Greenville County in Deed Book 17, at page 489.

Tegether with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenance to the said premises belenging or in anywise incident or apportaining.

To have and to hold, all and singular the premises hereby granted, with the appurtenances, unto the said heirs and assigns fereger, according to the form force and effect of the laws and usages of the State of South Carolina in such cases made and provided.
