 HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said Maurice Pearson
et al., the following described real estate: All that
 piece of land aforesaid, lying and being
 in Pick Springs Township, State of South Carolina, County of
 Greenville, having the following metes and bounds,
 to wit, beginning at a point on Merchant Street in
 the City of Greenville, corner of lot No. 7, and running thence
 west, the said line 20.3 feet to another corner of
 lot No. 7, a nail ditch; thence with this ditch as a line
 11.08 feet to the corner of lot No. 9; thence with the
 line of this lot 20.2 feet to Merchant Street; thence with
 said Merchant Street 72 feet to the beginning corner,
 and being all of lot No. 9, and seventy feet front, and
 known as Merchant Place made by Mr. Oliver Jones
 and being the same lot of land conveyed (to M. A.
 Pearson by J. H. Spangler) by deed recorded in the
 Office for Greenville County in Vol. 156, page 29.
