All that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid about fifteen miles from the City of Greenville, S. C. on the waters of the North Saluda River, bounded by lands now or formerly belonging to E. Barnett, G.B. Bridwell, Sloan L. Stroud and others, being part of a tract of land bought by Henry T. Stroud from Betsie Tally, et al, and marked lot No. 3 in the survey and subdivision of said tract of land made by J. G. Tally for Henry T. Stroud in November, 1892, containing 50 acres, be the same more or less, and runs as follows:-

Beginning on a poplar corner of Mrs. Betsie Tally and running thence S. 69 E. 5.00 chains to a stone; thence S. 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 3.25 chains to a stone; thence S. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 17.20 chains to a stone; thence N. 75 E. 23.00 chains to a stone; thence N. 18 W. 22.00 chains to a stone; thence S. 70 W. 18.00 chains to a stone at intersection of two creeks; thence down the meanders of the creek to the beginning corner. This being the same tract of land of which Sloan L. Stroud died seized and possessed, which said tract of land was acquired by Sloan L. Stroud from L. M. Grant by deed dated December 14th, 1893, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 366, at page 265.
