all that piece of land,

All that certain lot or parcel of land situated in county and state aforesaid on the south side of Beaverdam Creek about Ten miles north of Greenville, S. C.

Beginning at a stake on Wool's Branch, and runs thence N. 78.00 W. 693 feet to a stone in field on top of hill, thence N. 26.42 E. about 982 feet to a stake on south bank of Beaverdam creek, thence down and with the meanderings of said Beaverdam creek about 765 feet to mouth of Wool's branch (The branch has changed its course and now empties into Beaverdam creek a short distance above its old mouth) at or near Alwines corner. Thence up and with the meanderings of Wool's branch (old run) about 1150 feet to the beginning corner and contains Fifteen acres, more or less as per survey of J. H. Atkins, surveyor, July 10, 1901.
