in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said C. B. Stokes and Mrs. Hattie B. Stokes, their heirs and assigns forever;—

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land lying and being in the State and County aforesaid and having the following lines and bounds to-wit: Beginning at W. M. Hollingsworth corner on James St. and running thence almost North 152 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet more or less to an iron pin; thence East 55 feet to an iron pin; thence almost South 163 feet, more or less, to an iron pin of James St.; thence with said James St. 55 feet to the beginning corner and being part of lot #10 made from W. D. Neves Sub-Division for Noah M. Cannon also being the same lot of land conveyed to R. D. Dobson by Noah M. Cannon in deed dated October 17th, 1919 and recorded in office of R. M. C. in and for Greenville County, Vol. 56, page 572, and being, the same lot of land conveyed to A. J. Stokes by R. D.
