Whereas, by order of J. Lyles Glenn, U. S. District Judge, dated February 14, 1933, W. C. Coker was appointed Special Paster and authority was given to him as said Special Paster to sell certain lands belonging to the said Receivers, including lands hereinafter described; and pursuant to said order the said W. C. Coker, Special Master, did advertise said lands for sale in accordance with the terms and provisions of said order, and of other petinent orders of said court, and the same were offered for sale on Jan. 14, 1936, at prescribe the county seat of Greenville County, S. C. and at such sale the said property was bid in by J. Hudson Williams, Agent the highest bidder therefor, for the sum of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) and said bidder has assigned his bid to Mary A. Johnson & T. J. Worherson and said sale has been confirmed by order of J. Lyles Glenn, U. S. District Judge dated Jen. 17th, 1936 and the purchaser are ready to comply with the bid therein;

Now, therefore, Know all men by these presents, that we, W. C. Coker, as Special baster as aforesaid, William Elliott and abover Gage as Receivers of Peoples State Bank of South Carolina, under and pursuant to the authority and power conferred upon us by the several orders of court hereinabove referred to, and for and in consideration of the sum of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00 Dollars to us in hand paid by the said Wary A. Johnson and P. J. Wernerson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mary A. Johnson and T. J. Alpherson, their heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the county and State aforesaid, in ward 3 of the city of Greenville, on the west side of South Main Street, and having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof made by F. c. Rogers on September 7, 1909.

Beginning at a stake on the west side of South Main Street 117 feet, 7 inches, southward from the southwest corner of Main and Broad Streets, and running thence southward along said Main Street 62 feet to an iron pin on the northeast corner of lot formerly owned by R. N. and J. D.
