EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, H. M. Slater of Locust Valley, New York,
S. C. Baxter of Slates, South Carolina,
and Jas. Lybrand, Jr., of Slates, South Carolina,
did on the 2nd day of April, 1937, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Slater Manufacturing Company.THIRD: That the principal place of business is Slates, South Carolina.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is the conduct of a mercantile manu-
facturing or trading business within or without the State of South Carolina.
The corporation proposes to carry on the business of manufacturing, finishing,
converting, importing, exporting, buying, selling and generally dealing in and
with textile fabrics of all kinds and to establish, acquire, conduct or
operate mills, plants, factories and warehouses to the extent necessary, proper
or convenient in connection therewith; and to do all things incidental to
any such business. The corporation also proposes to acquire, hold, use, sell,
assign, lease and grant licenses or sub-licenses in respect of, pledge or
otherwise dispose of, letters patent of the United States or any foreign
country, patent rights, licenses, privileged inventions, improvements, processes, copy
rights, trade marks and trade names relating to or useful in connection
with any business of the corporation; and will generally carry on any bus-
iness not contrary to the laws of South Carolina, and to have and exercise
all of the powers conferred by the laws of South Carolina upon corporations
formed thereunder.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is six hundred (\$600) Dollars,payable forthwith in cashSIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is six hundred Dollars,of the par value of \$1.00 each at the time of the election of the Directors.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice a meeting of the subscribers was held on the

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected Directors:

H. M. Slater, S. C. Baxter and Jas. Lybrand, Jr.EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President H. M. Slateras Vice-President Jas. Lybrand, Jr. as Secretary, S. C. Baxteras Treasurer, W. P. Blackwell

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 163 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscriber having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

Greenville Daily Newsa newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are duly authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds, Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
