All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land lying and being situate on the Bancombe Road and Trubbs mountain Road just North of the village of Travelers Rest and containing 4.51 acres more or less and described according to a plat of the same made by B.A. Ellis, Surveyor on December 4, 1936, as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Bancombe Road and the Trubbs mountain Road and running thence along said Trubbs mountain Road N. 245 W. 620 feet to bend in Road; thence continuing along said Road N. 48. 135 feet to corner; thence S. 68-30 E. 310 feet to a pin, thence S. 11-30 E. 385 feet to corner on Bancombe Road; thence along said Bancombe Road S. 55-30 W. 453.2 feet to the beginning corner.

The above described tract of land represents the balance of a 33 acre tract which came to me by inheritance from my mother, Mrs. Luona Howard. Mrs. Howard acquired this property by inheritance from her mother Nancy J. Doak. It was conveyed to Nancy J. Doak by S. J. Southall master by his stock dated March 19, 1883, and recorded in the office of the P.M.C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 94 at page 460.

Luona D. Howard, mother of the grantor herein, died intestate leaving her sole heir at law her daughter, who is the grantor, Nancy J. Doak likewise died intestate leaving as her sole heir at law her daughter, who was Mrs. Luona D. Howard. The grantor hereof is variously referred to in the records pertaining to this property as Jessie Howard, Jessie Beavers, Jessie McMillan, Jessie Talleon, her maiden name being Howard, and she having since married three times, first to one Beavers next to one McMillan and now to one Talleon.

As a part of the consideration for this conveyance the grantee agrees to assume and pay the balance due on three mortgages now held by John A. Parks and covering the property herein described. That balance as of this date is \$774.41, and the mortgages in question are recorded in the office of the P.M.C. for Greenville County in Mortgage Book 255 at page 27, mortgage Book 282, page 173, and mortgage Book 252, page 142.
