First National Bank of Greenville and B. B. Waters as executors of the Will of R. D.
Dobson, deceased, their successors and assigns;

All that certain lot of land near the town of Greer, Greenville County,
State of South Carolina, beginning on Needmore Road, J. D. Ashmore line, and running
thence in an easterly direction 160 feet to an iron pin; thence in a northerly direc-
tion 100 feet to an iron pin; thence in a westerly direction 150 feet to Needmore Road;
thence in a southerly direction 100 feet to the beginning corner, and being the same
lot of land conveyed to Oliver McMakin by deed of A. D. Littlefield dated November 9th,
1927, and recorded in Deed Book 127, page 34, R. L. C. Office for Greenville County.

This deed of conveyance is given in confirmation of a certain order of the
