demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 10th day of May, 1937, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of sixteen hundred seventy five (\$1675.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said C. A. Rice,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said C. A. Rice

"all that certain tract of land in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a point on the south line of J. E. Baldwin's lands, at a distance 19.30 chains from the Laurens Road, and running thence 8.43 E. 8.72 chains to stone; thence 8.9 W. 8.03 chains to stone; thence 8.22 W. 2.49 chains to corner; thence 8.37 E. 12.26 chains to stone; thence 8.65 W. 14.72 chains to iron pin; thence N. 34 1/2 W. 15.60 chains to stone on J. E. Baldwin's land; thence N. 5 1/2 W. 19.45 chains along J. E. Baldwin's lands to iron pin; thence S. 71 1/4 E. 5.64 chains to oak; thence N. 79 E. 5.68 chains to iron pin; thence N. 54 3/8 E. 2.25 chains to iron pin at the beginning, containing 4 1/8 acres, more or less, and being the same land conveyed to Nannie E.
