In the year of our Lord, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said Florence H. Miller, wife of Coltriss Miller, their heirs and assigns;

All that certain lot of land, with the improvements thereon in the Town of Greenville, which Spring ownership, said County and State, on the West side of Miller Street and the South side of Arlington Avenue (formerly called Grace Street), adjoining lands of J. M. Clement and S. M. Glenn, and being the same lot conveyed to S. M. Glenn by deed of H. J. Sanford, April 17th, 1916, and recorded in S. M. G. office in Book 34, page 265, and having the following course and distances:

Beginning at an iron pin, S. M. Glenn's corner and running thence west Mill Street one hundred two (102) feet to Arlington Avenue (formerly called Grace Street), thence with said Arlington Avenue in a westerly direction one hundred Ninety-nine (199) feet to J.
