unto the said George L. Southern and his heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being near
Angel School, in Oneal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing
twenty-nine and four-tenths (29.4) acres, more or less, and known as Tract No. 2 of
the W. G. Southern Estate according to survey and plat thereof by H. S. Brockman,
Surveyor, dated April 6, 1938, and having the following courses and distances to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on community road and running thence N. 69.05 E.
1638 feet to iron pin; thence N. 40.34 W. 1438 feet to iron pin, thence S. 25.30 W.
1000 feet to stone; thence S. 89.84 W. 161.8 feet to iron pin on road; thence along
said road S. 30.30 E. 400 feet to the beginning corner.
