in the State aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said Frank White

All that piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in Austin Township, County and State aforesaid and being known and designated as tract No. 3 on plat of Nannie W. White property made by W. J. Riddle dated March 1936 and more fully described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin in the public road at A. J. Smith's corner and running thence along line of A. J. Smith's land N. 74-45 w. 990 feet to a stake at the branch thence along said branch as the line, N. 15-15 w. 848 feet to bend in said branch thence further along said branch N. 18 E. 333 feet to bend thence N. 19-30 w. 429 feet to a stake in mouth of branch at Islder Creek thence along said creek as the line N. 15 w. 290 ft to a stake thence leaving creek and running with Dillard's line N. 11-30 E. 376 feet to a cluster of white oaks thence S. 38-00 E. 2220 feet to a stake corner of lot No. 1 thence along line of lot No. 1 S. 37-30 E. 250 ft. to an iron pin in the public road thence along said road S. 33-30 w. 575.5 feet to the beginning and containing 41.40 acres more or less.
