Whereas, J. W. L. Holland departed this life intestate leaving as his sole heirs at law the following children J. P. Holland, F. B. Holland, E. G. Holland, C. E. Holland, and V. G. Holland, each now being the owner of an undivided one-fifth (1/5) interest in the tract of land hereinafter described, now therefore:

I, J. E. Holland, of Greenville County,

in consideration of the sum of Twenty Dollars,

do hereby give, grant, and release to my heirs above named, all my right, title and interest in and to the tract of land hereinabove described, now or formerly owned by me, in the State aforesaid,

in the State aforesaid, the persons whereof I hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said F. B. Holland, his heirs and assigns:

All my right, title and interest in and to (the same being an undivided one-fifth, all that certain tract of land in Dunklin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, having the following notes and bounds according to a plat made by J. R. Holland, Surveyor in January 1900.

Beginning at a stone 3x on line of William Wagon and running thence N. $33\frac{1}{2}$ E. 6.10 chains to stone 3 from; thence N. $35\frac{1}{2}$ S. 22.14 chains to stone 3 from; thence N. $35\frac{1}{2}$ S. 14.10 chains to stone 3 from; thence N. $52\frac{1}{2}$ S. 4.63 chains to stone 3 from on line of land now or formerly owned by A. Ramsey; thence N. $57\frac{1}{2}$ S. 16 chains to stake on bank of Peeby River; thence along the banks of said River as a line in a southerly direction to an Aza 3 from in old run of River, corner of land now or formerly owned by William Wagon; thence with the line of said land S. 76 W. 54.50 chains to the beginning corner, containing 143.50 acres, more or less.
