TITLE TO REALESTATE

ROBINSON, of Greenville County, State of South Carolina, GRANTEE, all of its right, title and interest in and to the timber and trees on that certain parcel or plot of ground situate, lying and being within the boundaries of that certain tract of land commonly known as the "McCombs-Poole" Tract, located on the waters of South Saluda River, in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, said plat of ground being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a stake on the Geer Highway, approximately Two Hundred feet (200') North and East from the Hickory Corner, common to the herein Grantor's "Dalton" Tract and the said "McCombs-Poole" Tract, and running thence, N. 20° 45' W. 1050 feet to a stone, thence N. 29° 50' E. 200 feet to a stone, thence S. 35° E. 1132 feet to a stake in the old Ceasar's Head Road, thence up and with the said Ceasar's Head Road 423 feet to the stake, the beginning corner, containing 7 acres, more or less.
