NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, R. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars,

to me paid by the said Eula Croft,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the
said Eula Croft,

"All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land, situate, lying and being in the
State of South Carolina and County of Greenville, containing eight (8) acres, more or less,
joining lands of Geo. Pickett, Pleasant Walker, Ad. Sullivan, and W. M. Vaughan, in Gantt
Township, on the Paper Mill Road, about six miles from the Court House in the City of Greenville
having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a stone 3x on road; thence running N. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 7.36 to a pine 3x; thence
N. 12 E. 5.50 to a stone 3x on the old line; thence S. 74 3/4 W. 23.95 to a stone 3x to
Pleasant Walker's corner; thence S. 28 W. 2.10 to a stone 3x in road; thence with said road S.
64 E. 11.50 to a bend in the road; thence S. 81 E. 1.80 to the beginning stone on road.
