NOW, THEREFORE, now All Men by These Presents, That E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars,

to me paid by the said L. J. Ports,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said L. J. Ports,

"ALL that piece, parcel or tract of land in Grove Township, County and State aforesaid, on waters of Grove Creek and Saluda River, and having the following metes and bounds, as shown by plat made by G. H. Miller, Engineer, February, 1925:

Beginning at an iron pin on plantation road, corner of tract of land owned by Y. G. Williams (formerly owned by Y. G. Williams) and running thence with plantation road N. 25-30 E. 278.2 feet to iron pin corner of Williams land; thence with his line, N. 64-30 W. 248 feet to iron pin; thence against with Williams line, N. 25-30 E. 228 feet to intersection of old road located and road to Piedmont; thence with old road location N. 42-10 W. 207 feet to a stake; thence still with old road location N. 64-30 W. 396.2 feet to stone; thence still with old road location N. 62-19 W. 307.4 feet to stone on; thence S. 27-10 W. 665 feet to a stone on; McMahan's corner; thence with his line, S. 75-27 W. 544.6 feet to iron pin; thence with line of Major Owens (formerly Y. G. Williams land) S. 64-19 W. 828.4 feet to beginning corner. The above tract is composed of the tract containing 4.25 acres, conveyed to Y. G. Williams by Anna Mitchum July 27, 1915, deed recorded in Deed Book 38, page 393, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, and a portion of land devised to Y. G.
