in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said R. T. Stutts All my undivided one-half interest in and to Fairview Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in near the Town of Simpsonville, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of a bridge, said point being in the center of First Street and in the center of a branch, and running thence with the center line of First Street in a northeasterly direction approximately the following courses and distances, N. 48-22 E. 235 feet; N. 62-04 E. 245 feet, and N. 65-10 E. 400 feet to a point in the center of First Street; N. 24-50 W. 19.2 feet from an iron pin the south side of First Street; thence S. 24-50 E. 320 feet to a branch; thence with the branch as the line in a westerly direction to the beginning corner, the traverse lines between an iron pin on the bank of said branch and said beginning corner being S. 81-24 W. 365 feet, S. 64-50 W. 138 feet and S. 85-06 W. 405 feet, containing 4.70 acres, more or less, as shown on plat made by Dalton & Neves, August, 1940.
