All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County,
State of South Carolina, (being in Ward Five of) the City of Greenville, on the East side of Calhoun
Street and having, according to a plat thereof prepared by C. M. Furman, Jr., Engineer, May 31,
1927, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
Beginning at an iron pin on the East side of Calhoun Street, at the corner of a 15
foot alley, which pin is 210 feet South of Pendleton Street, and running thence along the South
side of said alley, S. 73-45 E. 70 feet, 2 inches to an iron pin; thence S. 16-15 W. 50 feet to
an iron pin; thence N. 73-45 W. 70 feet, 2 inches to an iron pin on the East side of Calhoun Street
thence with the East side of Calhoun Street, N. 16-15 E. 50 feet to the point of beginning.

This conveyance is made to Cecil M. Tannery, Trustee, under the terms of the order
of Special County Judge W. B. McGowan, above referred to, said property to be held in trust by
Cecil M. Tannery, Trustee, until the minor child, Donald Levis Tannery, becomes 21 years of age, to
be held intact by her as a home for said Charles Sylvester Tannery and Donald Levis Tannery, until
Donald Levis Tannery attains the age of 21 years, at which time said trust shall cease and dis-
continue and said property, without further deed or conveyance, shall become the property of said
Charles Sylvester Tannery and Donald Levis Tannery, in fee simple forever. Until said time, the
said Cecil M. Tannery shall pay the taxes on said property.
