KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), and other valuable considerations, to it in hand paid by the United State of America, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the POSTAL TELEGRAPH-CABLE COMPANY, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware, does hereby for itself, and its successors and assigns, forever relinquish, surrender, transfer, release and quitclaim unto said United States of America all of the right, title and interest of said Postal Telegraph-Cable Company to and in all of the right-of-way from which it has removed its lines of telegraph and telephone near Greenville, South Carolina, along the route indicated on print attached to contract W-231-Eng. -872 between the parties hereto dated May 12, 1942, in which contract said Postal Telegraph-Cable Company agreed to so remove its lines of telegraph and telephone from within a certain area of the Greenville Airbase, Greenville, S. C., and in which it further agreed to so relinquish, surrender, transfer, release and quitclaim unto said United States of America all of its right-of-way as aforesaid.

Said Postal Telegraph-Cable Company, for itself and its successors and assigns, does hereby forever transfer and assign to said United States of America the following right-of-way grants covering locations from which it has removed its lines of telegraph and telephone in the section hereinabove referred to:
