granted the Duke Power Company for the construction and maintenance of an electric power line.
In removing the above properties the grantor is not to be liable to the grantee for
damages to the buildings or lands, it being understood that there will be some damages to both,
but the grantor is to restore the terraces, but it is recognized that the trench from which the
pipe is taken cannot be completely filled because of the area created by the removal of the pipe.
The right of ingress and egress to make these removals is expressly reserved.
