STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA,)
 COUNTY OF GREENVILLE. : SEPARATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS We, the undersigned Fred E. Rumler and June W. Rumler, husband and wife, both of said County and State, owing to divergent views and general incompatibility with respect to life and domestic relations, have this day mutually agreed to separate and live separate and apart.

NOW, THEREFORE, for mutual valuable consideration, we agree, covenant and contract as follows:

ONE: That each of us shall maintain a separate home, and that the said June W. Rumler shall release and relinquish all her right, title, interest and all claims of right and interest in and to any of the property, real and personal, of which the said Fred E. Rumler is now, or may hereafter be seized and possessed of. It is mutually understood and agreed that June W. Rumler does hereby release and waive all her rights to maintenance and support at the hands of the said Fred E. Rumler.

TWO: That the said Fred E. Rumler does hereby bind himself to refrain from interfering in any manner with the business or social life of June W. Rumler, and does hereby agree to remain completely away from the premises of the said June W. Rumler and does hereby bind himself to be responsible for damages for any breach of any portion of this Contract.

THREE: That each of the parties hereto shall possess himself or herself of the property now separately owned by them.

FOUR: That each of the parties hereto hereby covenant and agree that they will not, in any manner, interfere in the social or business life of each other, and that each of them shall conduct their social and business life in any manner that they see fit, without any suggestions or interference of either of the parties hereto.

FIVE: That either of the parties hereto may apply for an absolute divorce in the Courts of any or either of the States of the United States on the grounds herein set out and other necessary grounds, and in that event the other party shall consent to a Decree of Divorce and such proceedings, but such divorce shall in no wise alter, affect or release the other provisions of this Agreement.

SIX : That the provisions of this Contract shall be such as to place no limitations upon the parties, or either of them, as to personal, social or business activities or as to place of residence.
