



All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, about 2 1/2 miles from the City of Greenville, being designated as a part of Lot 34 of Block D in the subdivision known as Sans Souci Villa as shown on Plat recorded in Plat Book A at Page 510, and having the following metes and bounds:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the east side of Brockman Avenue at the corner of Lots 34 and 35 and thence running S. 57-25 W. 175 feet; thence S. 10-30 W. 62.1 feet; thence N. 57-25 W. 175 feet to Brockman Avenue; thence along Brockman Avenue N. 10-30 E. 60.1 feet to the beginning corner, and being the same property conveyed to William H. Cunningham by H. D. J. Parkedale et al on August 27, 1924, deed recorded in Volume 96, Page 22 of R. M. C. for Greenville County.

The grantors herein warrant:

(1) That the grantors, Clara J. Cunningham and Earl W. Cunningham, are the sole heirs at law and beneficiaries of the said William H. Cunningham, and that the said Earl W. Cunningham is the only child of the said William H. Cunningham;
