Willis, Engineer, dated January 20, 1949, said sub-division being a resubdivision of Lot #52 of the Estate of Vance Edwards as shown on a plat thereof by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, dated June, 1947, said plat being a revision of a plat of the Estate of Vance Edwards made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, dated December 1946 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "P", Pages 128 and 129, said lot 52 being a portion of tract 18 as shown on the recorded plat last above mentioned, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northwestern side of Lee Road, joint corner of Lots 3 and 51, and running thence with the line of Lot 51, N. 47-08 W. 258.5 feet to an iron pin; thence along the rear line of Lots 3 and 2, S. 42-52 W. 129.56 feet; thence S. 47-08 E. 184 feet to an iron pin on the Northwestern side of Lee Road; thence along Lee Road, k. 72-47 E. 150 feet to the beginning corner.
