





all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin

Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, on the Greenville-Woodruff surface treated road in the Old Prigrim Church Community, adjoining Gilder Creek, Lands now or formerly owned by B. M. Dillard, and Davis Property with metes and bounds as follows:-

BEGINKING at an iron pin in the center of the above named road, corner of B. Li. Pillard land and running thence along said road as a line S-83 E. 540 ft. to the corner of the Davis property; thence along Davis line S. 6-30 E. 1658 ft. to a point in Gilder Creek; thence a traverse line up the center of Gilder Creek as the line S. 69 W. 178 ft. to bend; thence S. 67-30 W. 161 ft. to bend; thence S. 78 W. 204 ft. to a point in center of said creek (Sweet Gum tree on the bank); thence leaving the creek and following the B.
