

All our right, title and interest in and to the real estate of the estates of S. T. Moore and Ida White Moore and being nore particularly described as follows:

All those certain pieces, parcels or tracts of land, situate lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of Jouth Carolina, partly within and partly without the town or Simpsonville being known and designated as tracts nos. I through 12 inclusive of the S. T. Moore estate, containing in the appreciate 280.1 acres, more or less, lying on both sides of the Beorgia road, as shown on plat thereof prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, February 17, 1949 and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for traceville County in Plat Book W, at Page 37.

ALSO, all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the town of Simpsonville, S. C., hear the Library and being of a triangular shape and being bounded by Curtis Street, Georgia Road, and Academy Street; said lot having a frontage of 25 feet, more or less, on Academy Street, and 100 feet more or less on Curtis Street, it being the intention of the grantors to convey all of their interest in the lot that lies in the triangle made by Curtis and Academy Streets and the Georgia Road, and which lies just south of the library, and comed by the S. T. Moore estate.
