

County, State of South Carolina having the following metesand bounds and courses and distances: Beginning on an iron pin in the center of the old Buncombe Road and running thence with said road N. 54.30 W. 357 feet to a bend in said road, thence N. 58.00 W. 207 feet to a bend in said road, thence N. 60.30 W. 626 feet to a bend in said road, thence N. 60.00 W. 287 feet to a bend in said road, thence N. 52.30 W. 122 feet to a pin in said road, thence with a new line N. 41.30 E. 1332 feet to a stake, thence S. 65.15 E. 1320 feet to a stone on the road, thence S. 2.30 E. 363 feet to a stone on the gully, thence S. 33.30 W. 976 feet to an iron pin, thence N. 54.30 W. 110 feet to an iron pin, thence S. 33.30 W. 210 feet to an iron pin , the beginning corner.
