

to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Alonzo M. Gerald, his heirs and assigns, forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being on the South side of Hillandale Circle near the City of Greenville in Greenville County, S. C. being shown as Tract 11 on Plat of Property of J. M. Elack made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, December 1947, revised June 1949, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in 11at Book "S", page 59 and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds. towit:

BEGINMING at an iron pin on the South side of Hillandale Circle at the Mortheast corner of Lot 11 as shown on said plat and running thence S. 17-15 E. 298.2 feet to a point in Creek; thence down the creek following the meanderings thereof to a point (the traverseline being S. 78-02 %. 100.8 feet; S. 67-16 W. 185 feet); thence M. 18-17 W. 250 feet to an iron pin on the South edge of a 40 foot un-named road; thence along the South edge of said road I. 60-11 E. 220 feet to a point on the South edge of Hillandale Circle: thence following the curve of Hillandale Circle (the chord being N. 87-28 E. 68.2 feet) to a point; thence continuing along the curve of Hillandale Circle (the chord being N. 62-11 E. 100 feet) to the beginning corner.

This is a portion of that property conveyed to me by deed of I. P. Toylor, dated September 17, 1930, recorded in the R.P.C. Office for Green-ville County, S. C. in Deed Book 157, page 108.
