Hollingsworth and Ella B. Hollingsworth (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John D. Hollingsworth and Ella B. Hollingsworth, their heirs and assigns, forever:

All that parcel or tract of land situate on the Northeast side of Laurens Road (also known as U. S. Highway No. 276), about five miles Southeast of the City of Green-ville, in Austin and Butler Townships, in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing 23.46 acres according to a survey made by Piedmont Engineering Service, May 17, 1951, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
