

overseer by virtue of the authority that gives he and if any stateoverseer is pastorins a church and the church is not satisfied with him, the church can call a meeting amonr themselves and suggest the matter over all. If it is their desire to change the stateoverseer from being their pastor or if they feel like their stateoverseer wont resign and give them another pastor, then they shall call the generaloverseer for a witness setting then if the state overseer wont resign, then he shall be brought into charge and his state and his position or his state shall be taken away from him, if the church has any right of all in changing pastors. And if the generaloverseer can pastor any work and wants to pastor and any time to pastor any church he can pastor any group of people in any local church or the church at headquarters as he likes until all matters is settled. Then if any group want him as pastor he can pastor for them as he likes and if the generaloverseer see it best to get another minister to take the pastor work, then he can do so without any objections. The general overseer and the state overseer shall agree upon this for pastor for the church and this quorum have, and shall have power to receive property by purchase, gift, devise or bequest to sell the same and apply the proceeds to the promotion of the objects for which it is created or to add to its property and apply the income and profit toward such objects. The general welfare of the society are not individual profit but the members are not stockholders in the local sense or the territorial. All the property shall be divided among the members, the general overseer and the church. Its ministers may establish churches in any state or country. The church or directors shall keep a record of all their proceedings which shall be at all times subject to the inspection of the general overseer or any other and its ministers and members cannot wave its property into any other quorum or chart at any time to appoint such subordinate officer or agents in addition to the general overseer and secretary of the church as the business of the quorum may require to assist him in the discharge of his office and fix the compensation of the officer so soon as they are engaged in payment of property bought by it. And for erecting buildings and improvements and for other purposes relating to the objects of its creation and secure the repayment of the money thus borrowed by mortgage, lease or deed of trust upon such property as may be owned by it and it may in like manner secure by mortgage, pledge or deed of trust or in any indebtedness which it may have lawfully contracted.
