

Shelton and myself on the east side of the Greenville and Northern Railroad, and running thence N. 29½ W. ten (10) feet to an iron pin, thence N. 60½ E. three hundred and two feet and ten inches (302' 10") to iron pin, thence S. 29½ E. ten (10) feet to iron pin, thence S. 60½ W. three hundred and two feet and ten inches (302' 10") to the beginning corner, and bounded by right-of-way of Greenville and Northern Railroad, L. H. Shelton and myself, containing 69/1000 (sic) of an acre, more or less.

Also: All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Bates Township, Travelers Rest, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the east side of Railroad, containing 4.75 (sic) acres, more or less, according to a plat and survey of the estate of J. L. Henderson, and others.
