



Said lots fronting each fifty feet on Second Avenue and running back in parallel lines one hundred and fifty feet, and being the same lot of land conveyed to J. W. Painter and Polly Rebecca Painter by W. F. Watson by his deed dated November 10, 1930, and recorded in the U.S. Office for the county and state aforesaid in Vol. 137 at page 337.
