47.00 chains to oak 3x; thence S 12° E 10.18 chains to oak 3x;  
thence S 31° E 8.80 chains to oak stump 3x; thence S 31-1/2° E 10.70 chains  
to holly 3x; thence S 27-1/2° E 4.40 chains to oak 3x; thence S 23° E  
10.50 chains to oak 3x; thence S 73° E 2.95 chains to oak 3x; thence  
S 50° E 3.35 chains to sweet gum 3x down; thence S 27-1/2° E 10.70 chains
