(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said.

W. B. Knight and Mabel T. Knight, their heirs and assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview

Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina in the Town of Fountain Inn on the west side of Woodvale Avenue, according to plat of the property of rlovd Weathers made on September 1, 1953 by O.C.Riddle and recorded in the R.M.C.Office for Greenville County and being more fully described, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin at the intersection of woodvale Avenue and a new cut street being the joint corner of property of the grantees and said new cut street, which belongs to the Mayor and his successors of the Town of Fountain Inn for Boy Scout purposes and running thence along the line of the grantees, S 70-46 W, 162 feet to an iron pin, corner of J. T. Gault property; thence N 1-31 E, 25 feet, more or less, to the edge of said new cut street; thence turning and running in a northeastern direction, along the edge of said new cut street to the iron pin, which is the beginning corner. Said tract of land being in a triangular shape.

Said property being a portion of the property conveyed to ". B. Knight Mayor of the town of Fountain Inn and to his successors in office in Trust for the benefits of the Boy Scouts of the Town of Fountain Inn by Floyd Weathers and Mary M. Weathers dated May 23, 1945 and to be recorded in the R.M.C.Office for Greenville County simultaneously with this deed.

The said new cut street as referred to in this description is acknowledged by the grantors and grantee as a public passageway and is shown as such on the plat above referred to.

This conveyance is being made by the grantors to the grantees in exchange for a tract of property that is simultaneously being conveyed to the Mayor of the Town of Fountain Inn, to his successors in Office in Trust for the Boy Scouts and said cross-conveyances are necessary in order to property correct the lines of each owner due to the fact that streets have been cut subsequent to the time of the original conveyance by Floyd Weathers and Mary W. Weathers to W. B. Knight as Mayor of the Town of Fountain Inn for Boy Scout purposes.
