BEGINNING at the intersection of Gap Creek Road with Tigerville (or Camp Creek) Road and running along the course of Tigerville Road, 5.50 chains; thence still along said road, 3.38 chains; thence along said road, 2.40 chains; thence N. 58 E. 9.60 chains to a point on the western side of Gap Creek Road; thence along said road, S. 2 1/2 W. 11.44 chains to the beginning point on Tigerville Road.
