in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One and No/100-----(\$1.00) and the love and affection which I have for my nephew and sister. Dollars the grantees herein to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Charles Winfield Johnson and Mary E. Norman

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said CHARLES WINFIELD JOHNSON and MARY E. NORMAN, their heirs and assigns forever, reserving however unto the grantor and unto Napoleon Hill, the husband of the grantor, the right to use, occupy and the right to receive the rents, profits and income therefrom during their joint lives and during the life of the survivor of them,

ALL that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Green-ville County, State of South Carolina, with all buildings and improvements thereon, being located on Altamont Road and known and designated as the major portion of Lot No. 6 as shown on plat of Halloran Heights, according to a Survey and Plat made by W. J. Riddle, November 9, 1952 and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, in Plat Book "BB", at page 93, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northeast side of Altamont Road at the joint front corner of Lots 6 and 7 and running thence along the joint line of said lots, North 59-04, East 219.8 feet to an iron pin; running thence North 28-35, West 110 feet to an iron pin; running thence North 42-18, West 113.5 feet to an iron pin; running thence South 47-42, West 69 feet to an iron pin; running thence South 9-21, East 20 feet to an iron pin; running thence South 50-26, West 140.9 feet to an iron pin on Altamont Road; at the joint front corner of Lots 1 and 6; running thence along Altamont Road, South 42-18, East 77.5 feet to an iron pin in the bend of the road; thence continuing along said road, South 28-35, East 92 feet to an iron pin, the beginning corner.

The grantor reserves unto herself and unto Napoleon Hill, her husband, the right to the rents, profits and income and the right to use and occupy the property herein conveyed for and during their joint lives and during the life of the survivor of them. It is agreed that the life tenants shall pay all taxes that become due on this property during their joint lives and during the life of the survivor of them and will pay all premiums on insurance. The amount of insurance will be determined by the life tenants and the survivor of them and/will make any repairs they deem necessary on the premises.

This is the same property conveyed to Annie Lou N. Hill by deed of Marcus D. Morley and Isabelle Ross Morley, dated September 24, 1958, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 607, at page 37.

Also all furnishings, furniture and fixtures located in the dwelling on the above property reserving however to the grantor and unto Napoleon Hill, the husband of the grantor, the right to use said furnishings and fixtures during their joint lives and during the life of the survivor of them.
