All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Paris Mountain Township, being known and designated as the major portion of Lot No. 3 as shown on a plat of the property of J. H. Mauldin being recorded in the R.M.C.
