Woodward, Engineer, February 11, 1945, and having, according to said survey, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point in street at corner of property now or formerly of George P. Wenck, John A. Mimms and O. C. Woods herein and property now or formerly of W. A. Kellett and running thence with the line of property now or formerly of George P. Wenck, John A. Mimms and O. C. Woods, N. 30-00 W. 158.6 feet to a point in the center of the C. & W. C.
