earnings are temporarily not available since said corporation is presently on strike, but that Defendant earns approximately \$25.00 per week by casual employment he is able to obtain;

- 7. That Defendant has in his possession household furniture and fixtures belonging to the Plaintiff:
- 8. The Court further finds that on or about June 1, 1959, Defendant requested Plaintiff to sign a release of her dower rights in the equity in house and land which they had occupied as a home, Laurel Heights, known as Lot No. 13, on the South side of Pairlane Circle, Route #6, plat, City and County of Greenville, South Carolina, in connection with a sale of said premises. Such sale included a mortgage from the buyers to Plaintiff dated June 19, 1959 for \$1400.00, payable at the rate of \$15.00 per month for 18 months, with the balance of \$1330.00 falling due on December 19, 1961, with interest at 6% per annum computed and paid semiannually; the monthly payments of \$15.00 commencing on July 1, 1959 and continuing on the same day of each month until so paid, all being secured by a mortgage from the buyers, one Allen B. Vaughn, and Kathleen C. Vaughn, his wife. Defendant agreed with Plaintiff on or about June 1, 1959 that if she would release her dower, she should receive for herself individually the \$15.00 per month and half of the lump sum and interest, when that lump sum and interest is paid. Part of the house was paid for out of individual carnings of Plaintiff. This agreement was not in place of any other support.

AND THIS COURT DOES THEREFORE ORDER, ADJUDGE AND DECREE:

ments for his medical and hospitalization insurance to cover the costs of his eldest daughter's surgical and hospital bills, or in the alternative, to pay for same himself; that said Defendant shall forthwith ship the household furniture and fixtures as listed on the Court's files herein to the Plaintiff at her home, shipping costs prepaid; that said Defendant shall further pay to the Plaintiff through the registry of this Court the sum of \$20.00 per week for the support of his dependents until further order of this Court; that this Court retains continuing jurisdiction of this matter as the circumstances of all the parties hereto may in all equity require;
