ALL that parcel or tract of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, situate on the Southwest side of Greenville-Laurens Road (also known as Highway 276) about five miles Southeast of the City of Greenville, in Austin Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on both sides of Laurel Creek, and having, according to a survey made by J.
