County, State of South Carolina, and containing 17.19 acres, more or less, according to a plat and survey made by E. E. Gary, Surveyor, on October 26th, 1948, and having the following metes and bounds, according to said plat, to-wit:
BEGINNING at an iron pin in the edge of road that leads from the old wasson place by C. Rodgers place, running thence N. 89-3/4 E. 4.95 chain to an iron pin; thence S. 7-3/4 E. 9.43 chains to an iron pin; thence S. 1-25 W. 23.20 chains to an iron pin; thence S. 892 W. 4.80 chains to a stone; thence N. 2-3/4 W. 21.93 chains along Old Indian Boundary Line to a point in or near the eastern edge of public road that leads from the old Wasson place by the old C.
