

ALL that lot of land, with the buildings and improvements thereon, situate on the Southeast side of Ponderesa Road, in the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, being shown as Lot No. 16 on plat of Section C-1 of Gower Estates, made by R. K. Campbell and Webb Surveying & Mapping Co., July 27, 1963, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book YY, at Page 112, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southeast side of Ponderosa Road at joint front corner of Lots 15 and 16, and runs thence along the line of Lot 15, S. 32-38 E., 252 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 47-22 E., 210 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot 17, N. 51-34 W., 238 feet to an iron pin on the Southeast side of Ponderosa Road; thence with the curve of Ponderosa Road (the chord being S. 50-58 W., 65 feet) to an iron pin; thence still with the curve of Ponderosa Road (the chord being S. 55-18 W., 65 feet) to the beginning corner.
