go in and upon that tract of land situate in the said County and State, described as follows:

The right of way to be acquired shall be seventy-five (75) feet in width during construction, but the width of the permanent right of way shall be fifty (50) feet measured twenty-five (25) feet from the center of said pipe line or lines in, upon and through the property of H. Harold Tarleton, Jr., Nick A. Theodore, Thomas E. Macfie, William M. McMillan, Emily Lite and Beverly Jeane Lite and Lynda Cheryle Lite, minors, beginning at survey station 7 / 23 and ending at survey station 17 / 63 according to a plat prepared by Black & Veech, Engineers, dated 1963 and being known as Contract No. 26 for the Greenville Water Works, which plat is on file in the office of the Greenville Water Works, City Hall, Greenville, S. C.

The location of the center of the said pipe line or lines as the said pipe line or lines pass through the said property is shown on said survey referred to above, and the entire right of way shall be approximately 1,040 feet in length.

The property affected by this right of way is the same conveyed to H. Harold Tarleton, Jr., Nick A. Theodore, Milton Lite, William F. Wilson and William M. McMillan by deed of John Carl Fisher dated July 31, 1965, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 558 at Page 227. Subsequently, William F. Wilson conveyed his interest therein to William E. Macfie by deed dated March 28, 1958, which deed is recorded in the said RMC Office in Deed Book 595 at Page 485.

and to construct and maintain in, upon and through said premises, in a proper manner, a pipe line or lines, air vents, blow off connections, manholes and other necessary apparatus incident thereto, using the necessary appliances and machinery for such work for the purpose of conveying water through the premises above described, together with the right at all times to enter upon said premises for the purpose of inspecting said line or lines and making necessary repairs and alterations thereon, together with the right to cut away and keep clear of said pipe line or lines all trees and other obstructions that may in any way endanger or interfere with the proper operation of or access to the same.

It is understood and agreed that the right of way to be used under this contract during construction is to be seventy-five feet in width throughout the entire length which is approximately 1,040 feet, and the damage, which The City of Greenville, South Carolina, is to be liable for during construction, is to be confined to this strip and nothing beyond. The location of the pipe line or lines, when laid, will determine the definite location of the right of way. The center of the pipe line or lines shall be accepted as lying twenty-five feet from the east boundary line of this right of way.
