CLUET CONVATH LEASE

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this first day of October, 1965, by and between NALLEY COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES, hereinafter called the Lessors, and EMERY STORES, INC.-CAROLINA, a South Carolina corporation having its primipal offices at 2715 Bond Street, Knoxville, Tennessee, hereinafter called the Lessee.

That certain building located on East side Sulphur Springs Road, (Berea) Greenville, South Carolina, being a building of brick construction and more fully described as that certain building in a shopping center bounded by Hunts Bridge Road, Farrs Bridge Road, and fronting on Sulphur Springs Road, said building to be sixty (60) feet in width and extending back between paralled lines a distance of one hundred (100) feet, and situated in the shopping center as marked in red on a plot plan more particularly described as exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof as demised space to be used primarily for Emery Variety (5; & 10¢) Store. \mathcal{JB} (5¢ & 10¢) Store.

This lease to include that plot of land on which the building is situated, with the appurtenances and rights of way incident

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described premises to the Lessee and its assigns, if any, for and during the term of twelve (12) years beginning the first day of October, 1965, and ending midnight September 30, 1977.

The Lessee agrees to pay the Lessor for and during the term of this Lease a rental of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per month, payable in advance on the first day of each month beginning on the first day of October, 1965.
