This matter comes before the Court for an approval of this transfer of Willis Street to Mrs. Prevost as part of the settlement in this litigated matter. In reviewing the matter, there is no question that it is to the public interest for this street to be abandoned as both the South Carolina Highway Department and the City of Greenville feel that it is not only unnecessary to keep this street open but would be a detriment both to safety and unnecessary costs. With this street being abandoned Mrs. Prevost owns all the land adjacent to it other than the land across Willis Street that was purchased in fee simple by the South Carolina Highway Department. Of course, it is elementary in the case of abandonment of a street that each adjacent landowner is entitled to take to the middle of the said street. In this matter, the South Carolina Highway Department, if it has rights in this street by reason of being an adjacent owner or for any other reason, does hereby expressly consent to transferring all of its right, title and interest in and to this street to Mrs. Grace Steele Prevost. The City of Greenville for and in consideration of Six Hundred Fifty (\$650.00) Dollars paid to it by the said Grace Steele Prevost likewise does hereby relinquish and transfer any right, title and interest that it has in and to this street and by action of its City Council has empowered the City Attorney to consent to this order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the South Carolina Highway Department and the City of Greenville pay to Mrs. Grace Steele Prevost the sum of Two Thousand Six Hundred (\$2,600.00) Dollars, and in turn Mrs. Grace Steele Prevost pay to the City of Greenville the sum of Six Hundred Fifty

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
