In order that the Corporation may have a correct record of ownership of all lots where a record is made, it is required that the record of the transfer be presented at its office so that a record of the transfer can be made. Where a lot is purchased and an extension of time granted by the Corporation for payment, the Corporation retains ownership of the lot until all charges due it are paid, and the Corporation reserves the right to remove the remains which may be interred on the lot, to a smaller lot rental in value to the amount paid on it, or to another location according to the rules and regulations of the Corporation.

An order in writing is required of the [] to whom it occurs in the agreed period, or to a single person in the event that a definition is given.

wherever a grave is to be opened, containing the name, age, sex and residence of the deceased, and a person from the Board of Health must be shown the Superior Court before interment is made.

lot owners shall at once notify the Corporation of any change in his or her post office address or name. No disinterment shall be allowed except upon order of the Executive Officers of the Corporation, and upon payment of the sum of \$100.00.

The written order of the owner or owners of the lot, in every case can only be made under the supervision of the Superintendent.

The Corporation shall have the right at all times to enter upon such and every lot for the purpose of making, cleaning, and policing it.

The Corporation from time to time may lay out one or more such avenues or walks, or make such roads, and regulations for the improvement and maintenance of the same, as it may see fit.

corporations or other government or public bodies as it may require or expedient to promote the general objects of the company.

to put any covering such as crushed stone or foreign substance, on any grave or lot. No coping or other means of marking boundaries of lots or graves can be used except corner stones as provided above. No sign indicating a lot or vault is "For Sale" will be permitted in the cemetery grounds.

or structure erected and no object or inscription shall be used or placed in or upon any lot without the consent of the Corporation.

No work of any character will be done open any lot except by company employees or by some person authorized to do so in its behalf, and no lawns, trees, shrubbery, structures, improvements, enclosures, etc., or excavations shall be

part, placed or dug upon any lot except by the cemetery employees as directed by the Superintendent. The trade of all lots, towns, and avenues as established, or changed, from time to time, by the cemetery and all improvements put or placed upon any lot shall not be altered or changed except by the cemetery. No trees, shrubbery, or plants shall be placed upon or removed from any lot, or any part thereof, except under a

removed from any or all property within the consent of the Corporation, but the Corporation shall have the right, from time to time, to plant, transplant, remove, or prune trees, shrubbery and plants upon said lots. The Corporation reserves to itself the entire control of every tree, shrub, or vine, growing within the property in nature, whether placed by the lot owner or otherwise, including the right of removal if it cons-

The Corporation will use reasonable care in examining trees and removing those apparently in unsound and dangerous condition or unsound and dangerous limbs and branches of trees, but it expressly disclaims responsibility for removal of trees such as may be removed when it considers such removal advisable.

sibility for damage either to persons or property resulting from falling trees or parts of trees.
No flowers or ornaments or objects shall be kept upon or about the same shall have become wormed, soured, or unsightly, and in case of the failure of the owner of any lot to remove any such flowers or other unsightly objects the Corporation shall have the right to remove the same and in no case will the corporation attempt to find some other place for them.

and soon after removal, nor will the Corporation be responsible for anything placed on lots or graves. No hanks, glass, crockery, wire, metal latches, watering-pots, glass case, covering box containing artificial flowers or any sort of receptacle for flowers, except such as are small, hollow the surface of the lawn for the grave lot, containing an inner apartment which may be lifted out while mowing the said lot, shall be allowed upon any grave or lot and all such are not and will be removed.

any and all such as are not sunk below the surface of the lawn, grave or lot, may be removed by the Corporation.

3. RULES FOR VISITORS AT THE CEMETERY.
The cemetery will be open from seven o'clock a. m. to sunset.
No firearms, refreshments, or intoxicating liquors shall at any time be brought upon any lot or in any portion of the cemetery; provided, however, that firearms may be used and discharged in case of a military anniversary.

funeral or on a regular appointed Memorial Day or other patriotic service.

No bird or animal shall be killed, wounded, or trapped upon, nor shall any animal or the eggs of any bird be removed from any lot or from any road, walk, or parkway, except by the Corporation. DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

The roadway and walk which are the property of the Corporation, we leave a road or paths for the use of the lots and visitors and let visitors use to have no other means of ingress or egress.

ALL PERSONS WALKING AND DRIVING SHALL COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE HIGHWAYS ACT, THE ADVICE OF THE HIGHWAY POLICE AND THE HIGHWAY POLICE WILL BE CONTACTED IF ANYONE IS FOUND TO VIOLATE THE HIGHWAY ACT OR THE HIGHWAY POLICE WILL BE CONTACTED IF ANY PERSON

No family member can be seated unless the lot owner or his immediate relatives, or a friend of the family, are seated in the cemetery.

5. BURIAL CASK. This casket is required to be made of wood, and a casket fund shall be set aside by the cemetery or all who purchase after September 1, 1945. This casket will be used by the cemetery to provide a burial casket of wood, veneer, glass, cream and to keep out insects and insects.

All fees paid to the cemetery for the care and maintenance of the plot, including the cost of the casket, shall be deducted from the amount due to the cemetery for the care and maintenance of the plot.
