(1) from the northwestern corner of Tract F in a westerly direction to South Carolina Highway No. 20 and (2) from the northerly boundary of the easement first referred to hereinabove in a northerly direction to Lenhardt Road.

TOGETHER with an easement for a railroad siding as shown on said plat, said easement springing from the Donaldson spur of the Southern Railroad (being a 70-foot right-of-way), and running in a westerly direction and then curving in a southerly direction to property now or formerly of American Hardware Supply Company.

The easements set forth herein are appurtenant to the premises herein conveyed and are to be used in common with other owners of the 83.08-acre tract of which the tract herein conveyed is a part, their successors and assigns forever.

TOGETHER with an easement for a railroad siding, having a total width of 20 feet, extending from the railroad siding easement referred to above and running in a southwesterly direction over and across property now or formerly of Joshua E.
