After extensive discovery and exchange of information between the parties, the Plaintiff has now conceded that the Greenville Water Works has a permanent right of way 65 feet in width for the purpose of installing, maintaining and conveying water through two (2) separate pipe-lines, and the Plaintiff has further conceded that said 65 foot right of way as located and claimed by the Greenville Water Works is a true and accurate location of said 65 foot right of way, and that said 15 foot right of way was granted with the same rights, privileges, members, hereditaments and appurtenances as permitted in the terms of said 50 foot right of way.

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing, and with the consent of the Plaintiff,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Greenville Water Works is vested with a permanent right of way and easement 65 feet in width running through and across the lands of the Plaintiff, as said right of way has been heretofore located by the Greenville Water Works, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that said 15 foot right of way recorded in Deed Book 212 at page 378, conveyed to and vested in the Greenville Water Works, the same rights, privileges, members, hereditaments and appurtenances as contained in said 50 foot right of way conveyed to the Greenville Water Works by said deed recorded in Deed Book 120 at page 11, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Complaint of the Plaintiff is hereby dismissed with prejudice, and forever ended.

LET the filing of this Judgment be indexed on the records of the RMC Office of Greenville County, South Carolina, as contained in Deed Book 120, page 11, Deed Book 212, page 378, Deed Book 902, page 379 and Deed Book 902, page 377.
