- (b) Major damage. Damage which renders more than
  two-thirds of the property untenantable shall not be
  repaired, reconstructed or rebuilt unless otherwise
  unanimously agreed by the co-owners, in which case
  the provisions of the act shall control.
- requirement that applicable building requirements

  must be met, any such repair, reconstruction or

  rebuilding must be substantially in accordance with

  the plans and specifications for each original

  building, or as such building was last constructed.
- 3. Certificate. The Insurance Trustee may rely upon a certificate of the Manager to determine whether or not the property damaged or destroyed is to be repaired, reconstructed or rebuilt.
- B. Estimates of Costs. As soon as practicable following damage to or destruction of any of the property in the condominium, the Manager shall obtain reliable and detailed estimates of the cost to place the damaged property in condition as good as that before the casualty.
- C. Assessments. If the proceeds of insurance covering the common areas and facilities or any residence are not sufficient to defray estimated costs or repair, reconstruction or rebuilding of the particular property insured, the Manager shall assess the owner, or owners, as the case may be, of the particular property to cover such excess of costs, which assessment
